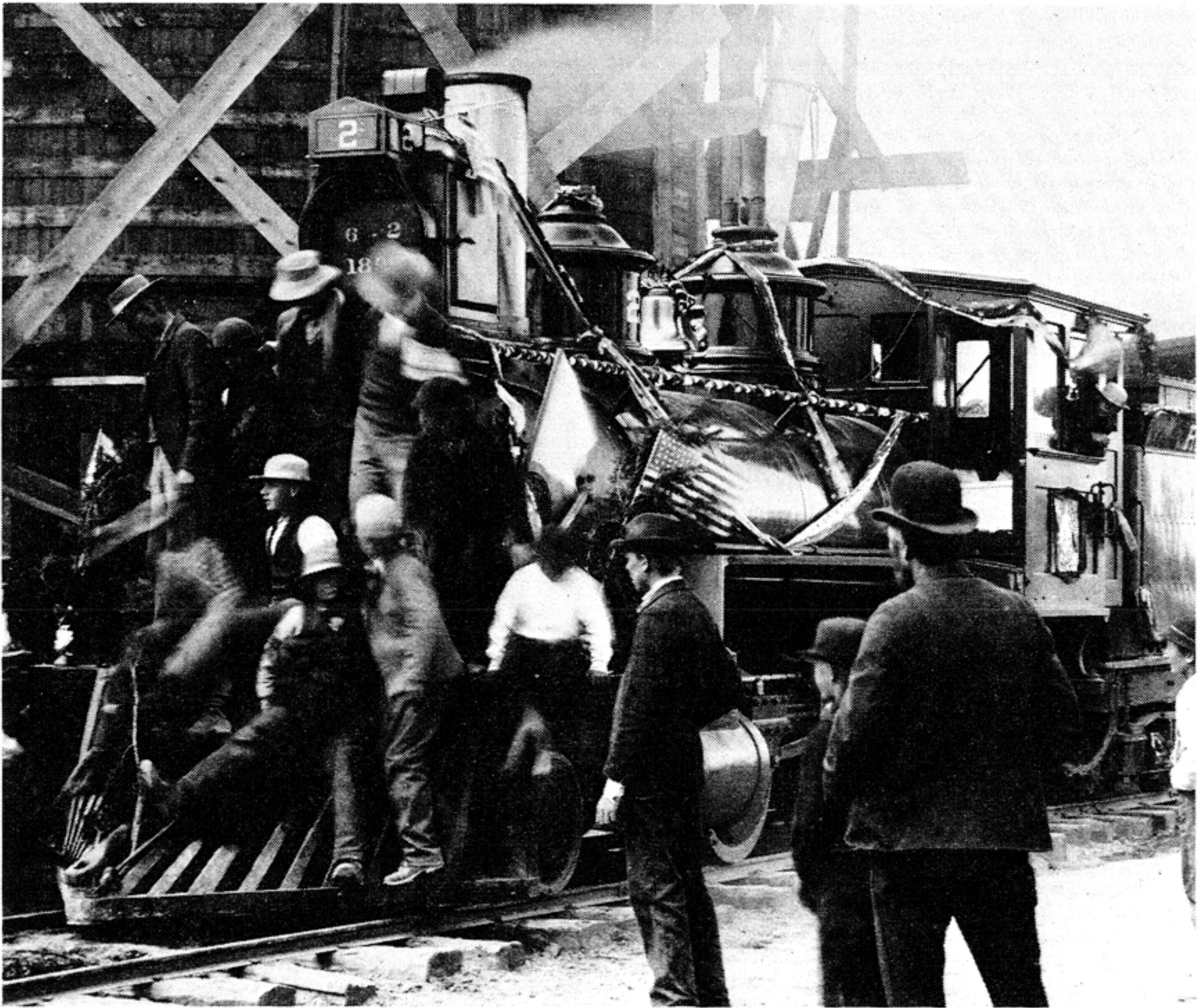


Emulsion
