BYU New Testament Commentary Books

As announced in the last issue of *Study and Faith*, we have published two new books. *The Epistle to the Ephesians*, a commentary by S. Kent Brown, is available from the BYU Studies office and website (\$29.99 hard cover; \$19.99 ebook). This commentary discusses every verse, explaining the language and rejoicing in the message of becoming "no more strangers and foreigners, but fellowcitizens with the saints, and of the household of God" (Eph. 2:19).

A new supplementary volume, *Relational Faith: The Transformation and Restoration of* Pistis *as Knowledge, Trust, Confidence, and Covenantal Faithfulness,* by Brent J. Schmidt, is now available (\$21.95 soft cover; \$9.99 ebook). This book describes what faith (Greek *pistis*) meant in New Testament times, how the meaning changed over the centuries, and how Restoration doctrine adds to our understanding of faith.

We also announce a reprinting of *The Revelation of John the Apostle*, a commentary by Richard D. Draper and Michael D. Rhodes (\$32.99 hard cover; \$12.99 ebook). Father of a Prophet: Andrew Kimball, edited by Edward L. Kimball with research by Spencer W. Kimball 274 pages, soft cover, \$19.95 \$7.00

Andrew Kimball presided for twelve years over the Indian Territory Mission and worked for years as a salesman in Utah and Idaho before being called to move his family to Arizona to preside over the St. Joseph Stake. He served a term in the Arizona legislature and exerted statewide influence as chair of the agricultural and horticultural commission. His exemplary loyalty and high principles were passed on to his son Spencer.

Wayward Saints: The Social and Religious Protests of the Godbeites against Brigham Young, by Ronald W. Walker 400 pages, soft cover, \$24.95 \$8.00

A story that includes spiritualist séances, conspiracy, and an important Church trial, *Wayward Saints* chronicles the 1870s challenge of a group of British Latter-day Saint intellectuals to Brigham Young's authority. William S. Godbe and his associates protested against Young because they disliked his demanding leadership style and resented what they perceived to be Young's intrusion into matters of personal choice. Their story is intertwined with many significant events that transpired in Utah Territory during Brigham Young's tenure as Church President.
